On the occasion of the release of the new CRS4 website, I am delighted to present a new medium via which the centre will communicate its scientific activities, both in-house and to the outside world.



We call it R<sub>to</sub>R (Researcher to Researcher) and it is a blog dedicated to the scientific activity of CRS4, written by researchers to communicate the latest news about our activities to other researchers, but also to students and entrepreneurs. Therefore, the contents will be technical-scientific, but we plan to use a style that's not too formal, in order to complement the complexity of the subjects by handling them in an attractive style.
